Response to official information request for PCC's application for the Covid wage subsidy

I refer to your request for official information received 2 June 2020 relating to PCC's application for the Covid wage subsidy. We have processed your request under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act (LGOIMA) 1987.

How many employees employed by Porirua City Council are contractors?

Are any of the staff in the building compliance division employed as contractors?

Are any of the staff in any other divisions of PCC employed as self-employed contractors?

- None. Self-employed contractors are not defined as employees

How many staff are employed in total by PCC?

- Council employs 412 staff in total

How many staff did PCC document in the Covid wage subsidy as working for PCC?

- Council documented 396 employees in its Covid wage subsidy claim

How many of the staff documented in the subsidy application are on individual contracts with PCC?


